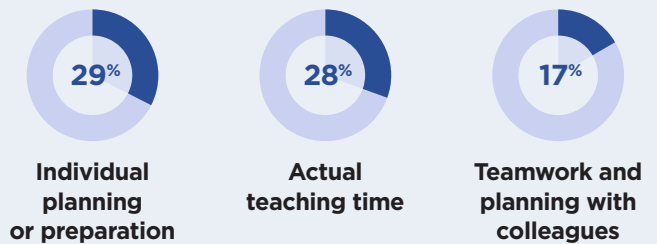
2/3 More than 2/3 of schools use 5 or more different channels of communication.⁸

This is just one example of the rapid evolution of school administrative roles and responsibilities.

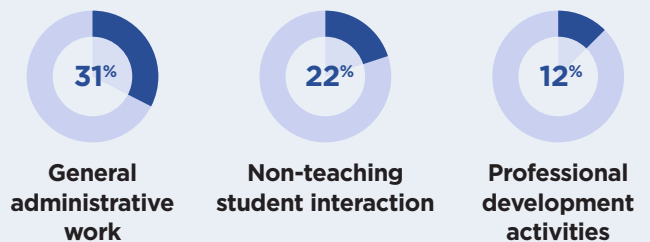
New technology must be versatile enough to adapt to changing administrative tasks as well as individual work styles. If it can enhance the work experience by adjusting to any scenario, even better.
